May 2013 Summary of Activity

Criminal Damage

There were reports of damage to property, with broken light fixtures and damage to mailboxes. This was a continuation of damage from last month and the offenders were subsequently arrested; case is pending.

Criminal Trespass to Property

Subjects fishing on a private lake were advised the lake was private property and asked to leave the area. The complainant did not wish to press charges, but wanted the offenders warned. No further action.

Three juveniles were cited for trespassing while riding dirt bikes along the Com-Ed property. Case is pending a court appearance.

Possession of Cannabis / Drug Equipment

Two subjects were cited for possession of cannabis and one subject was cited for possession of drug equipment.

DUI

There was one arrest for driving under the influence which originated as a traffic crash, cellular 911 call.

No DL / Suspended / Revoked DL

No Valid Driver's License – 7 citations; Driving while License Suspended – 2 arrests.

Premise Check

Officers discovered twelve unsecured doors during residential house watches. The premises were checked for signs of burglary and secured. Key-holders were notified.

Vehicle Lock-outs

One vehicle lockout was reported. Entry was gained by the responding officer.

Alarms

Officers responded to two burglar alarms with an unsecured door. The premise was checked for signs of burglary and a key-holder was notified.

Solicitor Complaint

A complaint regarding a solicitor soliciting without a permit was received and investigated. The subject and the company he represents were contacted and advised of the Village ordinance. No further action.

Other Public Complaints

A complaint of a builder cutting down heritage trees was received. The information was turned over to the Village for follow-up.

A resident advised that an email had been received regarding chickens that the writer believed resided at that address. The resident informed the writer that the chickens did not belong to that address and was advised to make no further contact.

Lost / Found Property

A subject reported losing a wallet somewhere along Sutton Road.

A motorist turned in a purse that was found on Route 62. The owner was contacted and came in to claim her property.

Missing Person

Complainant advised his wife has been missing for the past month. He also stated that he had recently filed for divorce. The officer was able to make contact with family members who advised that the wife was alive and well and left of her own free will.

Task Force Activity

NIPAS EST was activated in Arlington Heights for an armed barricaded subject. The subject was taken into custody without incident.

Neighbor Problem

A resident reported an incident where the neighbor became belligerent when each was trying to use the common driveway at the same time. The complainant only wanted documentation and requested that the offender not be contacted.

Suspicious Circumstance

A property manager turned in an item he found on the property and he believed kids were partying after hours. The item, a homemade pipe, was turned over to BHPD and the property was placed on an extra watch.

Identity Theft

A resident advised that she received a letter from the IRS regarding some tax issues. It was determined that someone out of state is using the complainant's name and social security number. The investigation is being handled by the IRS.

Animal Bite

An officer responded to an ambulance assist for a dog bite victim. The victim received a bite on his arm and was transported for treatment. The homeowner was advised of the ten day required observation period. The report was turned over to Cook County Animal Control.

A subject came into BHPD to report a cat bite that occurred while working at a local barn. The cat's owner was advised of the ten day observation period. The report was turned over to Cook County Animal Control.

Animal Incidents

Four stray dogs were picked up. The owners were located and responded to BHPD to pick up the dogs. No further action taken.

A complaint of neglect of horses was received. Contact was made with the Department of Agriculture to respond and investigate the incident. Four horses were removed from the property with the permission of their owner.

BHPD Officer Firing Weapon

An Officer responded to a report of injured wildlife used their duty weapon to terminate the suffering animal.
