**2022 Road Program**

Ekstrom asked for an update on the CRF program. Cieslica and Paul stated that Corrective Asphalt Materials is planning to begin CRF work in early November, weather permitting.

Dye reported that he will be meeting with the crew tomorrow regarding the remaining landscaping which is the last item on the punch list for the 2022 resurfacing program.

**2023 Road Program**

Dye reports that the condition of Spring Creek Road, particularly from Haegers Bend to Meadow Hill has been degrading and TAI is recommending the Village consider resurfacing it in 2023. In addition, there are a couple of shorter roads that could be included.

After reviewing document from last year's planning, Ekstrom asked why Spring Creek was not on the radar last year last year, but is being proposed this year asking if something change dramatically? Cieslica reported that the condition of the roadways deteriorated a lot over the last year.

Ekstrom stated that it makes sense to plan to address some of the Villages long roads in the next few years. The Committee had significant discussion on the options for the road resurfacing program. The Engineers will review a couple of additional roads including Braeburn, Oak Knoll and Spring Creek, then make recommendations on them as well as what roads might be good candidates for CRF. Discussion on what the 2023 road program will continue at the next Roads meeting after the additional information is received. For budgeting purposes, the Committee recommends holding the Roads & Bridges budget form 2022, but will review this further and revise the recommendation, if necessary, prior to Board approval.



### **On Street Parking**

Ekstrom reported that this discussion came about because of the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) was parking their construction equipment, during the resurfacing of County Line Road on Steeplechase Road. Ekstrom asked Colditz for his recommendations.

Colditz presented a rough draft summary of parking complaints over the years, noting that there have not been many.

The Village currently does not have a restriction on overnight street parking. He noted that it is seldom, but there have been complaints for on street parking after snowfall making plowing difficult.

Chief reviews a list of items the Village could consider if they wish to change the laws.

The Committee discussed the situation at length and possible actions the Village could take.

The Committee agrees that the best course of action may be to allow the Chief of Police to designate areas as no parking if situations warranted. Colditz was directed to research and prepare draft language for discussion at a future meeting.
