## Good News! The Route 14 Underpass Project Is Slated to Begin This Year

As we begin 2024, I am so pleased to let our community know that after a very lengthy period of preparation and sourcing funding, the Route 14 underpass project is slated to begin this year. For the last several years, our dedicated. Village staff has been diligently at work with various federal, state, and local agencies to lay the groundwork for this important project, and how we are finally here.

For those of you who may be new to town, this project will create an underpass under the Canadian National Reliway tracks at Route 14, which will provide an unblocked route through Barrington when trains criss-cross our town. This is a critical infrastructure improvement that will lead to increased safety and less traffic congestion in town.

Since 2009, after the Canadian National Railway took over the E.M.E. railroad that runs directly through our Village, trains blocking traffic in town have become much more prevalent and disruptive. So for the past fifteen years the Village of Barrington worked with the federal and state governments to secure funding to build the underpass, which will lower the grade of Route 14 by 23 feet under the CN tracks. This will alleviate congestion at that crossing and create a clear path through town for emergency vehicles and to Advocate Good Shepherd Hospital.

While the Village secured the project funding and has been the lead agency for Phase II (detailed design phase), the project is being permitted and approved through the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT), as it is on a state route.

The federal government, as well as the Canadian National Railway, are also involved with the Village and IDOT in Phases II and III, so there are many moving parts that affect project scheduling. Land acquisition and railroad coordination are well underway, but final certification and permit approvals will need to meet dead-lines ahead of the project letting (the date when the contractor bids are due and opened).

As a result, the anticipated project timeline has been updated; here is what you should start to see in 2024:
